The minor consists of 15 credits of coursework beyond the pre-requisite courses (PORT103 and PORT203) or their equivalents. Students complete intermediate to advanced immersive language courses that prepare them to communicate, understand, read and write in Portuguese. In addition, students will gain a rich understanding of the cultural, political, and social aspects of Brazil and other Portuguese-speaking countries. The minor's focus on culture, cinema, and language allows students to explore their interests while deepening their capacity to communicate across cultures.

<sup>1</sup> Portuguese PORT228 and PORT478 are conducted in English. The majority of written assignments will be in Portuguese for those students in the minor program.

- At least 6 credits should be taken through courses above PORT203 taught in the Portuguese language.
- At least 9 credits must be taken in upper-level courses (3xx or 4xx level).
- A maximum of 6 credits may be applied to the minor from courses taken at other institutions.
- A maximum of 9 credits may be applied from a University of Maryland Study Abroad program.
- All courses must be passed with a grade of C- or better.
- An overall GPA of 2.0 in the minor is required for graduation.
